II. Grades & Evaluations

A. Grading Summary

Letter grades are calculated as A=90%-100%, B=80%-89%, C=70%-79%, D=60%-69%, F=0%-59%. The breakdown showing how your final grade is calculated is shown below.

B. Tests & Quizzes

Tests and quizzes are an important part of evaluating student progress, and contribute greatly a student's final grade (see above). Students are expected to take all tests and quizzes seriously and to do their best. Any student who misses a test has one week from the original test date to retake that test. Quizzes cannot be made up.

Test questions that were marked incorrect can be made up for one-third credit either before school or during lunch up to a week after the test.

C. Homework

Homework assignments will be announced during class, posted on the class calendar, and posted on the class website. Homework is always due the next day or, in the case of block days and weekends, the next time the class meets. Homework must be placed in the homework basket before the bell rings in order to be considered on time. It is the student's responsibility to turn in homework. Late assignments may be turned in up to one week after their due date for 80% credit. No late homework will be accepted after that time.

D. Champion Points

C. Absences & Tardies

Students who miss class should speak personally with the teacher to receive the information they need to make up work. Students who are tardy should sign in on the tardy sheet when they arrive in class and quietly take a seat.

D. Hall Pass

E. Cellphone Use

Cellphones can be a great tool and asset to learning in the classroom. They can also be a distraction. Inappropriate use of a cellphone during class will result in a verbal warning. A second infraction will result in the confiscation of the phone until the end of class. This policy is not meant as a punishment but is meant to reduce in-class distractions.

F. Copying & Cheating

Many assignments and activities require teamwork and cooperation among students, but some do not. Tests, and quizzes are meant to evaluate an individual student's ability, not the ability of other students sitting near them. Any student caught or suspected of cheating will receive a zero on that assignment and further action may be taken on the student who was being copied.
